# Missouri 911 Board Initiatives: 2022 Legislative Session

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Passed and Signed by Governor:

- **LAGERS** - legislation to allow telecommunicators in second and third class counties to be eligible for LAGERS retirement

Not Passed in 2022:

- **Reclassification** of telecommunicators as first responders
- **EMS rulemaking authority** - transferring authority from DHSS to the Missouri 911 Service Board

# Missouri 911 Board Initiatives: Statewide NG911 Funding

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Governor approved \$18 million for statewide NG911 efforts

- \$8 million for statewide GIS
- \$10 million for statewide NG911

HB 3020 - American Rescue Plan Funding - **Section 20.115. To the Office of Administration For the Department of Public Safety For compiling, standardizing, and maintaining Geographic Information System (GIS) data in support of the statewide implementation of Next Generation 911 (NG911) and enhancements From Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery - Health and Economic Impacts Fund (2463). . . . . \$18,000,000**

The 911 Board is currently awaiting detailed guidance on the funds that will inform timeline, strategy, etc.

# Missouri 911 Board Initiatives: Statewide NG911 Funding

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## 911 Service Board Efforts - **GIS**

- ✓ Established a GIS committee consisting of 911 professionals and subject matter experts
- ✓ Completed the Statewide GIS Assessment
- ✓ Stakeholder engagement, including participation on the State GIS Advisory Committee
- ✓ Held a vendor roundtable
- ✓ Supported GIS improvements through the Board's grant and loan program

# Missouri 911 Board Initiatives: Statewide NG911 Funding

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## 911 Service Board Efforts **NG911**

- ✓ Established an NG911 committee consisting of 911 professionals and subject matter experts
- ✓ Completed a statewide NG911 feasibility study
- ✓ Established three multi-county ESInets through the Board's grant and loan program

# Missouri 911 Board Initiatives: Statewide AED Registry

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- After exploring many options, the Board approved Pulsepoint to support the state's AED registration efforts.
- As a next step, the Board is gathering interested counties to use Pulsepoint to support and maintain their AED registries - these counties will be provided instruction and training by Pulsepoint
- Free to counties

# Updates for PSAPs: Federal 911 Funding

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## **Next Generation 911 Funding**

- [H.R. 7624](#), authorizes a seven-year spectrum auction with a provisions to fund NG911 with proceeds up to \$10 billion
- H.R. 7624 was passed out of the House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Communications and Technology by 29-0 and by the Committee on Energy and Commerce by 52-0
- Currently, the resolution is on the House calendar for consideration by the full body

## Updates for PSAPs: Grant & Loan Program

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In an effort to ensure a coordinated and cohesive statewide NG911 effort, the summer grant cycle is currently on hold, pending further guidance on state funding.

# Updates for PSAPs: Grant & Loan Program

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## Program Award Areas

- Include one or more public safety answering points (“PSAPs”) located in a jurisdiction with a 911 service level of basic (defined by the Board to mean “No 911 equipment”);
  - **Consolidate two or more PSAPs;**
  - Consolidate 911 services within or across defined regions;
  - Move one or more PSAPs up one or more service levels;
  - Meet **the NENA i3 Solution Standard for Emergency Services IP Network;**
  - Become **NG9-1-1 compatible;**
  - Include purchasing 911 communications equipment that is currently non-existent (versus replacement of existing 911 communications equipment);
  - Add **Text-to-911** (defined as the ability to send a text message to reach 911 emergency call takers from a mobile phone or device).
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- Additional Considerations for Application Review
    - Projects that address award priority areas in the most **cost-efficient** way possible
    - Projects with outcomes focused **on call-taking and citizen locating**
    - Projects that address the **highest-need areas**
    - Projects that help in moving the **state forward as a whole**

# Updates for PSAPs: 988

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On July 18, 2022 - 988 was launched nationwide to replace the national suicide hotline.

The Board is working to collaborate with 988 in four key areas where they have formed task forces:

- Messaging/Communication
- Technology and equipment
- Training
- Transferring process/protocol
