



Q3 Does your local PSAP use EMD to evaluate emergency medical calls and provide pre-arrival instructions?





Q4 Has your local PSAP now begun to ask the basic questions needed in order to identify possible infectious patients?





Draft resolution for Missouri 911 Service Board regarding access to the addresses of homebound COVID-19 outbreak persons.

Problem:

During this time of national emergency we have first responders seeking to treat and transport patients who are suspected or confirmed positive for COVID-19. First responders are also working to protect themselves from infection (and thus remain viable to assist with other emergencies) and to protect their families from unexpected exposure. The state and nation are suffering from an extreme shortage of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) making the issue of early and accurate notification of possible exposure situations even more important. First responders do not have enough PPE to wear for every call they respond to.

Currently some PSAPs established policies to ensure they have address information of individuals who are or highly suspected or confirmed positive for COVID-19. This information is then used to recommend first responders to use full PPE when responding to at those locations.

Some additional PSAPs would like to incorporate this strategy into their efforts to protect first responders but local public health agency will not provide them with the addresses of confirmed or highly suspect COVID-19 cases.

Requested Solution:

Local public health, state health department, local health care providers, local health care coalitions who are aware of those people who have been identified as positive or highly suspected of COVID-19 provide the addresses of where these people are located to the local public safety agencies, including PSAP's.

We request only the address and not any patient name or patient identification information.

We recognize that some PSAPs may not be able to participate for a variety of reasons such as inability to load and display this information, inability to protect the information, liability concerns or other concerns. In such situations we suggest PSAPs find simple methods of such as reference lists of address for dispatchers to consult or provide this information to all local public safety partners for their own internal process to help alleviate any burdens assumed on the PSAP.

We believe that those PSAP's with stringent security policies and processes in place, many due to the nature of the law enforcement information they presently handle, should be allowed to have this information including law enforcement and fire/ems.

The public safety agencies should only be provided the "necessary minimum" information so that responders know that full PPE should be used (when possible). PSAPs CANNOT report that someone at the address has a disease, or is suspected to have a disease – rather, PSAPs can alert first responders that full PPE should be considered to be used. This is the same alert that is currently given if, through questioning of a caller, it was determined that someone at the address had a fever.

Legal Evaluation:

Many PSAPs do not fall under HIPAA as covered entities. HIPAA is not a legal answer to why some public health agencies will not work with their local PSAP.

There is a general provision under HIPAA that would allow for this exchange of information.

HIPAA, 45 CFR § 164.512(j) which states: "A covered entity may, consistent with applicable law and standards of ethical conduct, use or disclose protected health information, if the covered entity, in good faith, believes the use or disclosure: (A) Is necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the health or safety of a person or the public; and (B) Is to a person or persons reasonably able to prevent or lessen the threat, including the target of the threat."

There is language under HIPAA which would allow for increased consideration during a time of emergency.

"EMMINENT DANGER: Providers can share patient information with anyone as necessary to prevent or lessen a serious and imminent threat to the health and safety of a person or the public -- consistent with applicable law and the provider's standards of ethical conduct. "From the government HIPAA web site listed as during a "severe disaster"

Loan Application Follow-Up Questions

Questions to consider regarding repayment periods:

- When does interest begin to accumulate?
 - o 6mos after start of project
- How is length of time determined?
 - o By amount of loan, not length of project, e.g.:
 - Average of 12 mos for every \$50K borrowed, not to exceed total of 48months
- How to accommodate Good Cause and/or authority for non-payment periods?
 - Board should have authority to authorize temporary periods of non-payment at their discretion

Questions to consider regarding interest rates:

- Should rate vary based on applicant financials, length of loan, or should standard rate be determined by Board for a set period of time?
 - Same rate should apply to all applicants per application period. Rate will be reassessed by Board per application period.
 - Length of loan could be considered a determining factor by Board—shorter repayment periods could qualify for lower rate.
- What is range of rates that should be considered?
 - o 0% -- 15%, prime should be considered guiding point.
